Tuesday the 10
this day commences with light breeze
and good weather from the N.W. ship
whose topsails and jibs heading
to the N.E. two ships in sight and
flotilla of ice latter part light breeze
and good weather from the N.W. ship
running through the ice to the
Northward double reef topsails so ends the day
Lat 54:26 Long 153:17

Wednesday the 11
this day commences with light breeze
and good weather from the N.W. ship
running through the ice to the
Northward one ship in sight in the ice
latter part light breeze and good weather
from the S.E. ship steering N.W.
through the ice nothing but ice in
sight no clear weather so ends the day
Lat 54:40

Thursday the 12
this day commences with light breeze
and good weather from the S.E. ship
steering N.W. through the ice all
sail set pushing our way though it
latter part light breeze and good weather
from the N.W. ship heading to the
Northward all sail set ship in clear
water broke out molasses
so ends the day
Lat 54:46

Cruising in the Cebatek Sea 1852

Friday the 13
this day commences with light breeze
and good weather from the N.W. ship
with all sail set heading to
the Northward in clear water ice in
sight and one ship broke out water
latter part strong breeze and good weather
from the S.E. ship running through the ice
steering N.W. all sail set the janes in sight

Saturday the 14
this day commences with a gale from the
S.E. and a snow storm hove the ship
two under close reef fore and maintop sail
the ship janes in company latter part
strong breeze and rough weather from the
S.E. ship steering N.W. by W under
short sail clear water so ends the day
Lat 56:00 Long 153:30

Sunday the 15
this day commences with strong breeze
and snowing weather from the N.W. ship
heading W by N under short sail
clear water broke out a barrel of
flour latter part light breeze and good
weather from the N.W. ship heading
N.W. all sail set one ship in
sight no ice
so ends the day
