Her Passage Home From The S. Islands

1860

Lat 29° 40' Long 121° 25'

Thursday the 9th
First part of the 24 hours light
breeze and good weather from the
N.W. ship heading N.E. by E. with
all sail set one sail in sight
an english bark to watch making
sundry later part light breeze
and good weather from the N.W.
ship heading N.N.E. with all sail
one sail in sight

Friday the 10th
First part of the 24 hours light
breeze and fine weather from the
N.W. ship heading N.N.E. with
all sail employed to work in
the riggen later part light breeze
and fine weather from the N.W.
ship heading N.E. all sail set em-
ployed in bundling some two sail in sight

Saturday the 11th
First part of the 24 hours
light breeze and fine weather
from the N.W. ship heading
N.E. by N with all sail employed
in bundling some finished 40 bundles
later part light breeze and fine
weather from the N.W. ship heading
N.N.W. with all sail set to
work in the riggen

Lat 29° 46' Long 121° 46'

Sunday the 12th
First part of the 24 hours light
breeze and fine weather from the
N.W. ship heading E.N.E. with all
sail set the main topsail yard
made full later part light breeze
and fine weather from the N.W. ship
heading N.W. with all sail set
some the day

Monday the 13th
First part of the 24 hours light
breeze and fine weather from the
N.W. ship heading E.N.E. with
all sail set later part light breeze
and fine weather from the N.W. ship
heading E.N.E. with all sail set
employed at work on the riggen

Tuesday the 14th
First part of the 24 hours light
breeze and fine weather from the
N.W. ship heading E.N.E. with all sail set
employed at work on the riggen and
began tarring down later part
light breeze and baffling good weather
from the N.W. ship heading
N.W. with all sail set employed in setting
up the boat stows
