Monday September 14th

This day begins with fine weather etc breeze from E. S. E ship steering S. E by S at 6 P.M. wind etc saw nothing worth note set up fore topmast rigging etc ends this day

This day begins with fine weather fine breeze from E. S. E ship heading S. by E at 1 P.M. strong breeze and squalls from E. S. E ship steering S. E by S saw several sail

Wednesday September 16th

This day begins with strong breeze from E. N. E ship steering S. E by E at 1 a.m. stow gaff topsail and fore topgabant sail at 2 P.M. stow main topgabant sail and put 2 reefs in fore topsail at 4 P.M. reefed main top sail at 10 P.M. heavy squall wind shifted to S. W. furled fore topsail mainsail and gaff

Thursday September 17

This day begins with heavy gail from S. W. ship steering S. E with prudent sail middle of this day strong gail from W. with heavy squalls steering S. E later part steering E. S. E with prudent sail

This day begins with heavy gail from W. with squalls at 3 a.m. set hump 1 reef out of fore topsail at 2 P.M. moderated main sail at 6 P.M. st. main topgabant sail at 9 P.M. made all sail wind S. S. W ship heading S. E so ends this day

Saturday September 19th

This day begins with fine weather wind S. S. W ship heading S. E with all sail saw one sail at 10 a.m. calm at 2 P.M. etc breeze from S. W. ship heading S. E
