

Remarks November 1857  
Friday November 13<sup>th</sup>

Spoke Ship

This day begins with  
strong gale from S W  
at 11 am commenced boiling  
at 11 am spoke ship  
Portland of New York  
bound to Melbourne New  
Holland at 3 PM squally  
ship heading S. wind W  
being fresh boiling  
no observation

Saturday November 14<sup>th</sup>

This day begins with  
heavy weather wind  
S W heading S E  
with 2 reefs in main  
topsail and fore sail  
boiling at 10 am being  
at 9 moderated at 1 PM  
calm boiling so  
ends this day  
Lat 38.15 South  
Long 115.37 East

Sunday November 15<sup>th</sup>

Whale showed  
55 barrels

First part of this 24 hours  
calm at 4 am finished  
boiling at 11 am calm at 6 PM  
blowing strong from W W  
at 7 PM commenced stowing  
at 12 finished  
Lat 38.20 S

Bark *Midas* of P. D. Falman Master  
Monday November 16<sup>th</sup>

First of this day wind W  
steering S E middle of  
the day fine weather wind W  
steering S E with all sail  
later part the same  
so ends this day

Lat 38.50 South  
Long 118.15 East

Tuesday November 17<sup>th</sup>

First of this day wind W  
and backing saw sail  
at 11 am wind S E ship  
heading N E by E at 1 PM  
tacked ship heading S  
later part the same  
so ends this day

Lat 39.55 S  
Long 119.00 E

Wednesday November 18<sup>th</sup>

First of this day wind  
S E ship heading S W by S  
at 2 am tacked heading  
E by N at 7 am heading  
E at 10 am heading E by N  
at 6 PM heading N E by E  
later part about the  
same

Lat 39.05 S  
Long 121.07 E
