Thursday November 19th the

First of this day fine
weather wind E & ship
heading E N E
at 7 am inched ship
heading S W at 12 calm
later part calm
so ends this day

Friday November 20th the

Saw sperm
whales

First of this day calm
at 7 am light breeze
from N steering S E by E
at 6 PM saw sperm whales
boarded and struck one
and drew more whales
in sight at 7 PM boats
came on board

Saturday November 21st the

Saw right
whales

First of this day fine
weather at 1 am saw
right whales board
and struck one and
cut at dark. Middle
of this day wind N & heading
N W at 3 PM wore ship
head S E saw right whales

Long 122.00 E

Bark Midas of R. Salaman Master
Sunday November 22nd the

First of this day strong
breeze from E S E at 2 am
saw sperm whales board
struck and drew
ship heading S E with
double reefed topsails and
courses at 12 1/2 m breeze S by E
made all sail wind N E
heading E so ends this day

Long 122.03 E

Monday November 23rd the

First of this day fine weather
wind N heading E at 7 am
wind W steering E S E
Middle of this day the
same later part about
the same at 11 am saw
black fish

Lat 41.35 S
Long 124.34 E

Tuesday November 24th the

First of this day fine
weather wind W steering
E S E Middle of this
day the same at 10 PM
relaxed fore topsail
blowing fresh from W

Long 126.6 E
