Monday Dec 7th

First of this 24 hours wind
light and bafflin from
N and W steering E N E
with all sail middle
part blowing on from W to W
at 7 PM strong breeze from W
later part fine weather
wind W steering E N E
with all sail

Tuesday December 8th

First of this 24 hours commences
with fine weather strong breeze
from W steering E N E with all
sail Middle part fine breeze
from W to W later part wind W at
10 PM breeze increasing bent new
main top-gal sail

Lat 47.20 S
Long 176.09 E

Wednesday December 9th 1857

Strong breeze from W to W steering
E by N at 8 am furled
fore top gal sail and
fly jib breeze increasing
at 7 am 2 main top sail and
fore sail blowing heavy
from W heading E N E
at 1 PM moderated at 3
moderate wind S W steering
N N E

Lat 46.40 S
Long 179.30 E

Barth Meidas of the T. J. Talmann Master
Thursday December 10th 1857

First of this day fine weather wind
S W steering N N E with all sail
middle part fine breeze from the westward
later part wind S W steering N N E
got a luner and found the chronometer rate

Lat 44.40 S
Long 177.30 W

Friday December 11th

This 24 hours begins with fine weather
fine breeze from S W steering N. E.
with all sail Variation 0.6 degrees
middle part light breezes from S W and W
later part fine weather wind W steering
E by N 1/2 north

Lat 44.02 S
Long 177.06

Saturday December 12th

First of this 24 hours fine weather
fine breeze from W steering E by N 1/2 N
at 1 am saw the land bearing E by N
at 7 am saw breakers a head
at 5 PM fled to heading E by W
shortened sail 2 reefed topsails
middle part blowing heavy in squalls
at 11 closed reefed topsails at 1 PM split
foresail at 3 showed fore topsail
heading W land bearing E dist 25 miles
