

March the 20 Hills

Tuesday 2nd

got a raft of water and stowed
it down one watch on liberty
and landed provisions

Wednesday 3rd

Employed at ships duty
joining water and stowing
it landed one Keg of butter

Thursday 4th

got a raft of water
and stowed it down
one watch on liberty sent
a raft of casks on shore

Friday the 5th

got a raft of water
and stowed it down
one watch on liberty

Saturday the 6th

all hands employed at ships duty
got 10 barrells of potatoes

Sunday the 7th

one watch on liberty the
rest on board

Monday the 8th

Employed at ships duty
one watch on liberty ships ready
for dis 2 men ran away put them
in irons for stealing the meat

Tuesday the 9th

all hands on board Employed at
ships duty

Wednesday the 10th

at 5 am got under way
stood out of the harbor with head
wind at 10 came to anchor on the corner
of the reef at 5 P.M. got under way
and dropped in side of the harbor
2 men brought on board in irons that ran away

Thursday the 11th

at 6 am got under way stood out
with land breeze at 9 am pilot
left winds light and baffles with
rain at 1 P.M. land about 4 miles
off

Friday the 12th

First of this day thick squally weather
running along the land within about
10 miles at 7 am blowing heavy from S.E.
put 2 reefs in fore and main topsail
stowed all the light sail middle part
heavy squalls lying off the S.E. end of
swaybe at 5 P.M. cept of ran down to
beach at 11 P.M. came anchor close in
shore

Saturday March 16th

Fine weather at 1 am captain went
on shore at 3 am boats brought
off 60 barrells of potatoes and a
few pumpkins middle part calm
at 5 P.M. got under way stood out to S.E.
wind light and baffles at 12 land light
about 25 miles made bearing N.W. by N.
distant 30 miles
