

Remarks for April, 1858

Friday April 9th

First of this day fine weather strong breeze from N. E. W heading W with all prudent sail middle part late air and bafflin from N heading W and W by S later part at 3 M bits breeze from E steering N. W. by W employed bracking out for provisions No observation

Saturday April 10th

First of this day fine weather; fine breeze from S E steering N W by W with all sail employed fitting cabin stove at 11 am blowing heavy from E S E steering N W with close reefed main topsail and foresail at 12 showed foresail and reefed too blowing heavy in squalls at 2 PM tack in main topsail carried away fore top mast stay sail ship lying with main spread later part the same

Sunday April 11th

First of this day blowing heavy from N E heading N. E. W at 11 am a sea boarded on the starboard quarter and stowed the bulworks at 2 set main topsail middle and later part blowing heavy

Sunday April 12th

First of this day blowing heavy from N E heading too with close reefed main topsail and foresail at 4 am stowed the bow boat and broke the forward davit had to take her in on deck middle part at 5 PM at foresail we turned one reef out of the main topsail at 10 set close reefed fore topsail and bent main spruce

Tuesday April 13th

First of this day blowing heavy from N E heading too with close reefed main topsail and foresail heading N. E. W middle part the same later part bent fore staysail

Wednesday April 14th

First of this day strong N E wind heading N. E. W with prudent sail middle part wind E. N. E ship heading N later part the same employed pumping the bow boat steering N by W No observation
