First of this day thick at 2 a.m.
paramor shore bears N^o 20 miles
wind E steering N. W. by N
with all sail at 9 raikey and thick
middle part thick fog wind E. S. E
steering N. W. by N later part
wind N. E steering N. E. by N; thick
fog

Thursday April 22nd the

First of this day fine weather
from N^o E steering N. P. off
middle part steering N. S. by N
with all prudent sail thick
fog later part the same
regging full of ice
Lat 53. 18 N
Long 150. 30 E

Saw our
first
ice

First of this day strong E. wind
steering N. P. W. with prudent
sail at 4 a.m. saw ice thin
porage ice stood through
to clear water middle part like
air and thick fog later part
the same saw heavy ice thick fog

Saturday April 24th

See

First of this day like air and
thick fog heading eastward
along the ice middle part steering
N with like air from S running
through ice later part the same
thick snow storm the water is
covered with ice

Sunday April 25th

See

First of this day thick ice steering
N by E snowing heavy again luffed too
with head yards aback middle part
the same later part; at 5 P.M. steering N
with 2 reefs in topsails no clear water
in site like surface ice
Lat 54. 33. N
Long 150. 03. E

Monday April 26th

See

First of this day fine weather
wind N. W. steering N by E with
2 reefs in topsails nothing to be
seen but ice middle part
running through the ice heading
N by N wind N. W. later part
the same ice is getting heavier

Lat 54. 57. N
Long 151. 30. E
