

Remarks for April 27 1858

Tuesday April 27th

See First of this day fine weather
wind S.W. heading S.E. at 4 a.m.
wore ship head S.W. nothing to
be seen but see Middle part
like air from S.W. heading W by S
with 2 reefs in topsails latter part
the same wind as S.P.M. made all
sail

Long 151.53. E

Wednesday April 28th

See First of this day fine weather like
air and calm heading S.W.
Saw nothing but see Middle part
like breeze from S.E. steering
S.P.W. see quite broken later
part and increases at 10 P.M. close
reefed fore and main topsails
stowed the courses at 12 wind increases
furlled fore topsail ship hove too
in the ice no clear water in site

Long 150.48. E

Thursday April 29th

See First of this day blowing from S.E.
Ship heaving under bare poles
in the ice Middle part blowing from
S. and snowing heavy latter part
wind veered to S.W. at 11 P.M. stopped
snowing set in foggy with heavy
swell ship pounding heavy in the
ice

no observation

Friday April 30th

See First of this day thick fog and
heavy swell see setting S.W. wind
S.W. at 1 a.m. wore ship head S.W.
no sail set Middle part moderated
Got Stinker heavy swell latter part
like air from W. steering S.W.
at 4 P.M. raised a Stinker
in the ice at 12 got him to the
ship

Saturday May 1st

See First of this day eating at 4
a.m. finished at 10 commenced
boiling Middle part calm
latter part wind like and
baffled heading S.E.
latter part the same
boiling No obser

Sunday May 2nd

See First part boiling blowing
fresh from S.W. heading
S.E. Middle part the
same latter part finished
boiling wind W steering
S.P.W. short sail
