

Remarks for June 1858

Saturday June 26

First of this day thick and overcast
wind E steering S by E
Middle part like breeze from N
steering S by E at 1 am buffed too
ready to later part steering
S saw ships both steering S

Lat 54.45 N
Long 141.50 E

Sunday June 27

First of this day fine weather
like air from N steering S at 1 am
saw the land bearing S by E first
27 miles going with the China
and Reindeer

Middle part calm later part
like breeze from S.E. steering
S.E. W cape Morier bearing
S.E.

Lat 54.20 N
Long 141.12 E

Monday June 28

First of this day thick foggy
at 3 am lit up saw the west shore
cape Morier bearing E, saw a
plenty of seals
Middle part fine weather wind
S.E. steering S.E. W at 12
came to anchor later part
thick repairing ships bows
at 11 PM got under way steering
S.W. the west shore dist 15 m

Tuesday June 29

Saw
whales

First of this day fine weather
wind S.E. standing to westward
saw several whales going
fast leaved and chased them
did not strike

Got a
Whale

Middle part came to anchor
at 3 PM the boats left the ship

the boats left and went on shore

Wednesday June 30

This day boating and
whaling fine weather
saw whales but they was
shy and did not get any

Thursday July 1

Fine weather boating
at 12 PM fine weather boating
the boats off whaling
saw whales but did not
get any at 10 am came on
board
