

Remarks for July 14. 1858
Wednesday July 14th

First of this day fine weather
wind E steering W by NW
P. land bearing W by E dist 10
miles. Middle part strong breeze
from E. steering S.W. by W.
later part like breeze from E.
steering S.W. by S. Saw ships
to anchor under the land
saw 2 seals and 2 whales

Thursday July 15th

First of this day thick fog
and calm at 2 am came to anchor
in 20 fathoms of water in
in Lemons Bay. Middle part
thick and rainy later part rainey
at 1 P.M. got the ship under
way stood to the S. and westward
thick air and bafflin saw a
heavy body of ice in the
bay

Friday July 16th

First of this day like air and
bafflin with fog squalls
wind at W.S.W. head S.W.
Middle part thick fog and
calm at P.M. like air at S.W.
wore ship head W.S.W. Later
part like air and bafflin sounded
and got 27 fathoms of water
thick fog. So ends this day

Bark, Midea of R. Tallman Master
Saturday July 17th

First of this 24 hours thick
fog like air and bafflin
from the S. and W. heading to
the Westward
Middle part at 1 came to anchor in 20
fathoms of water at 5 P.M. 2 boats
left the ship and went in Muckery
bay

Sunday July 18th

First of this day thick fog
at 7 am the boats came in
saw several whales but did
not get any. Middle part
calm and foggy

Monday July 19th

Laying at anchor and whaling
in shore saw whales but did
not get any like air
and thick fog
