

Remarks for August 1854

Friday August 27th

First of this day fine weather,
wind W steering S. E. Spoke
Ship Oregon of Fairhaven
Middle part like breeze & S. bying
with head yards aback later part
steering S. wind S. by S. at that
Lat 56. 16. N
Long 137. 10. E

Saturday August 28th

First of this day fine weather with
light air and bafflin saw 2 ships
in shoar of us dark bearing W. N. W.
dist 15 miles steering S. E. &
Middle part wind S. E. & 9 P.M.
came to anchor close to the land
at 5 pm got under way worked up to
San harbor and came to anchor
the Captain went on shore
So ends this day

Sunday August 29th

First of this day at anchor at San
Carried a man to the hospital
Sanford at 4 am the captain came
off and got the anchor working out
with light air & I dropped the anchor
and showed up the sail it being calm
Middle part calm later part at 6 P.M.
got under way light air and bafflin saw
a whale in shoar at 10 pm heading S. E.
fine breeze

Monday August 30th

First of this day light air and
bafflin at 7 am head N. E. land
distant 15 miles Middle part
blowing fresh from N. E. at 12 heading
S. E. with 2 reefs in topsails
later part at 4 pm stood in shoar
at 12 pm land distant 15 miles
blowing fresh and raining

Tuesday Aug 31st

First of this day blowing fresh
from N. E. working to N. E. with
2 reefs topsails and courses
Middle part blowing fresh from N. E.
later part the same head bearing W. N. W.
distant 15 miles working to N. and Eastward

Wednesday Sept 1st

First of this day blowing fresh from
N. N. E. working to the N. and eastward
with the land in sight
Middle part moderated at 12 wind
at S. W. steering N. E. later part
light breeze at S. W. steering S. E. W.
and to the westward Lat 57. 10. N
Long 140. 23. E
