Thursday Sept. 16th

The Boat off whaling
Saw 1 whale at 7 pm all
Onboard at 8 pm taken the anchor
standing to the Eastward saw 1 ship
wind at N.E. 1/2 E

Friday September 17th

First of this 24 hours fine weather
wind at N working up along the
land spoke ship Hibernia from
the arctic Ocean Middle part
strong breeze at N being with
head yards aback later part
steering W 1/2 N at 12 noon foggy Island
bearing S dist 4 miles

Saturday Sept. 18th

Fine weather wind at N steering
to the westward blowing fresh
land distant 5 miles saw nothing
worth note

Sunday Sept 19th

Fine weather wind at W.S.W.
at 4 am off Sealowland bay
middle part wind at N steering W
later part like first at N.E.
steering W 1/2 E
Lat 58.00 N

Bark Midas of R. E. Galman Master
Monday Sept. 20th

First of this day fine weather
wind at N.E. steering W 1/2 E
at 4 am calm middle part
calm later part fine breeze at N.E.
steering W 1/2 E with all sail

Lat 57.45 N
Long 144.01 E

Tuesday Sept. 21st

First of these 24 hours
fine breeze from N.E. steering
W 1/2 E with all sail saw
sail to the northward steering
to the S and Eastward
middle part wind at W heading
S.E. at 6 pm backed ship heading
S.W. at 7 pm backed heading
S.W. spoke ship L. O. Richmond

Long 143.03 E

Wednesday Sept 22nd

First of this day good weather
wind at S.W. heading S.W. by W
at 5 am saw the land bearing
S.W. middle part wind at S.W. and
S.E. heading W.S.W. later part
at 2 pm backed ship head S.W.
at 4 wind at N steering W at 10 calm
No observation
