

Remarks for September 1858

Thursday Sept 23rd

First of this day fog thick and
rainy wind S. by E. after
4 P.M. saw a ship steering to
the eastward; land bearing S. by W.
dist 30 miles getting casks ready
for water Midday part wind S. by E.
steering W. later part blowing
strong from S. by W. head W. by S.
at 11 P.M. moderated wind S. by W.
heading S. by W.

Lat 56.30. N
Long 139.31. E

Friday Sept 24th

First of this day fine weather
wind light and variable from S. by E.
and westward working up to
air at 8 A.M. came to anchor
in 10 fathoms of water 7 ships
in air
later part sent a raft of casks
on shore for water and 1 for wood
So ends this day

Saturday Sept 25th

First of this day got 1 raft
of water and 1 Boat load of
wood and stowed it down
later part blowing strong from S. by E.
and raining
Left the ship
have 1 cask of
Bread and
1 Hog of Butter

Bark Abides of P. O. Hallman Master

Sunday Sept 26th

First of this day thick rainy
weather later part getting
wood and water

Monday Sept 27th

First of this day blowing strong
from S. by E.
later part getting wood and water
got 5 loads of wood and 1 raft
of water

Tuesday Sept 28th

Fine weather all 4 Boats
off whaling saw 1 whale
A dark came aboard
saw 1 whale

Wednesday Sept 29th

Fine weather all 7 Boats off
whaling saw nothing
A dark came on board

Thursday Sept 30th

First part strong breeze S. by E.
Boats off whaling saw
nothing later part got
the ship under way steering
S. by E. with all sail
