Tuesday Oct. 19th

First of this 24 hours blowing heavy from N.E. heading S by E. Middle part the same rain. Later part moderated wind at 11 steering E by S with all reefed main topsail and fore sail 9 1/2 all sail

Wednesday Oct 20th

First of this day like breeze S by E steering E by S very heavy sea Middle part wind a E heading S. E taken in the life sail. Later part at 6 pm put 2 reefs in the topsails at 10 blowing heavy a E heading S. E and raining hard at 11 taken in fore and main sail

Thursday Oct 21st

First of these 24 hours blowing heavy gale from E. N. E heading S. E with double reefed main topsail and fore sail at 5 am wind shifted to S heading E saw a boat and pass a stern about 1 mile Middle part wind E steering E at 1 pm close reefed fore topsail Later part wind S. W with heavy squalls and rain steering E

First of these 24 hours fine weather like breeze a N. W steering E by N at 5 am wind at first overcast Middle part fine breeze from N. W steering E by N. Later part wind at 11 N. W steering E by N with all sail
