Sunday Tuesday Oct 24th

This day crystal first of this day fine clear weather
the meridian fine breeze from W steering E.S.E.
and changed the middle part the same: Later part
day from Sunday wind S.W. steering E.S.E. with
moderate gale

Sunday 24th

Monday Oct 25th

First of this day moderate gale
from E. steering E.S.E. at 7 am
gale increased showed the topgal
sails fore jibs and gaff top sail
middle part and a S.W. heading
E.S.E.: latter part blowing on
from S.E. head E.N.E. at 1 pm
put 2 reefs in the top sails at 2
taken in the jibs and sprakes
at 4 pm blowing heavy and raining
at 1 more moderate maid sail
at 11. steering E.S.E. wind S.W.
No obser

Tuesday Oct 26th

First of this day strong S.W. gale
steering E.S.E. at 3 am fine clear
weather more moderate all sail
at 7 am heavy squall taken in the tops
sail and boreed to W. middle part
strong west by gale, at 1 pm shot
the fore top sail and put 1 reef in main
top sail at 6 sent the fore top sail down
latter part steering E.S.E. with
strong reef main top sail and fore sail
repairing fore top sail

First of this day strong W
gale steering E.S.E. with all
prudent sail at 4 am bent
the fore top sail and close reefed
it. middle part and shot
up steering E.S.E. with 2 reef top sails
latter part more moderate all sail
steering E.S.E.

Thursday Oct 28th

First of this day fine weather
but heavy sea wind at W
steering E.S.E. with all sail
encompassed backing out small
shots. middle part wind at S.E.
thick rainy weather at 2 pm taken in
the top sail at 4 put 2 reefs in the
top sails. latter part blowing and raining
wind at S.E. head N.E. by E with 2 reef
top sails jibs and main sail showed
at 7 pm beryed a man by the name of
Barry who died 5 pm of the consumption
after a long spell of sickness

Friday Oct 29th

First of this day wind like with
rain squalls at 3 am wind at S.W.
steering E.S.E. with prudent sail
at 4 wind boreed to S.W. and commenced
blowing very heavy all hands to take
in sail at 5 dove too under bare
poles. lost the fore top mast stay date
at 12 more moderate. at 3 pm set close
reef main top sail and fore sail
cut off steering E.S.E. with S.W.
gale
