Friday April 1st 1858 Remarks on board
 This day begins fine winds from the S.W.
 Ship running through the straits of Misma
 Straits came on dark come to anchor in ten
 fathoms water hard sandy bottom 1/2 fathoms
 chain out paid. all sails set the watches
 at 7 pm. Middle part calm. latter part
 at 7. am got under way at 11. am came to
 anchor in Hakkodada harbor in 6 fathoms of
 water 55 fathoms of chain ahead the next sand
 on shore so ends the day on board of the mides

Saturday April 2nd 1858 Remarks on board
 This day begins fine light winds from the S.W.
 At 1 pm sent a boat in shore for provisions
 Got up 26 casks for fresh water locked then
 Weather squally from S.W. at 6 pm paid out
 to 50 fathoms of chain ahead middle part
 bruck the same sent on shore 25 casks for fresh water
 One watch on liberty so ends the day on board

Stray remarks on other ships
 Capt going of the cut-off is very dangerous it
 and not expected to live small junk's came in to
 day from different places nothing more of note
