

Barque Midas of New Bedford Mass

Monday June 27th 1859. Remarks On Board Indaco

Stopped in Schooner harbor with 5 boats steared up Shonts near
Bay saw plenty of small whales did not attempt to strike
Boats being loaded down with provisions pitched our camp
On the west shore opposite of the two Sisters. Myself 2^d & 3^d
Water with me. so ends this day

Thursday June 28th 1937. Remains in Bear Ponds

thick fog and rainy went of saw a plenty of small whales
going up the bay.

Friday 11th. The ice is all on the E. shore extending
from Stinker Island E. N. E. to the gut from thence down the
E. shore to the two sisters from thence towards the west
shore about 4. miles to 8 miles wide & bare

Tuesday June 29. 1859 Remains in Louis Michel

Went up the bay saw nothing so ends the day
Ship still to S. head

Thursday June 30th 1859 Remarks

Saw a few whales near the two sisters this morn.
And rainy so ends the day

Friday July 1st 1859. Remarks

Saw nothing thick and rainy ship lay in of elbow
Island so ends the day

Saturday July 2nd 1859 Remarks on Coast

Saw nothing thick and rainy and a moderate gale from N.W. boat on C. Shore in attempting to cross the bay nearly swamped but got our safe. To end the day
