This day comes in light winds from the W. Spoke ship Reindun in the 50 passage. Landed for 400 lbs. wheat on board of the Reindun got a fine for a fly jib boom for which I paid capt. 25 lbs. by 8/8 dollars per cask. Mid part strong breeze from the W. S. W. Steer S. E. and C. S. E. and C. by S. Latter part Steer C. by S. E. sail in light steam C. by S. west of main royal and strong breeze. Lat. 49° 16. 18 Long 158° 27. 00

Wednesday Sept 28th 1854, Remarks

Long 160° 27. 00
This day comes in strong winds from the W. Steering ship C. by compass under all sail & sails in light employment in making a fly jib boom. Mid part fresh breeze from N. W. Latter part moderate. Set foretopmast standing sail and lower steering sail. No sail in sight. So ends this day on board. We have certainly had a very nice time in getting out of the sea and an offing more so than usual. (That is)

Set fore sail close reef foretop sail double reef main kept ship away C. by N. by compass 11.05 S. variation 8. Mid part strong breeze and rainy latter part fine weather fresh breeze from W. S. W. Made all sail.

This day comes in fine weather pleasant breeze from W. S. W. Ship under all sail Steer C. by S one sail in sight employed in getting out fly jib boom built new fly jib. Mid part squally latter part fine strong breeze from W. S. W. one sail in sight. Set topmast lower and maintopmast. So ends the day.
