

Remarks on Board the Bk Miles of N. B.

Thursday March 29

Lat 36-13 N First part of the 24 hours light breeze and good weather from the N by E ship heading S by W with all sail passed two ships steering to the Eastward middle part light breeze latter part strong breeze and good weather from the S by W ship heading S by W took in the light sails so ends the day

Friday March 30

Lat 37-26 N First part of the 24 hours light breeze and baffling the weather good the ship heading from N by W to N by E set the maintop gallant sail and fly jib in the gulf stream light breeze and baffling the weather good ship heading on either tack working to the N by W spoke the bark Aqueduct Thornton of New York 13 days from New Orleans bound to Boston so ends the day

Saturday March 31

Lat 38-47 N First part of the 24 hours calm the weather clear and good two sails in sight, one bark and one schooner all steering to the Northward latter part strong breeze and good weather from the S by W ship steering S by W by S with all sail so ends the day

On Her Passage Home From the S. Islands 18-60

Sunday April 1-1860

First part of the 24 hours strong breeze and good weather from the S by W ship steering S by W with all sail set the main royal at 8 A.M. saw Black Island took a Pilot on board started for the Red Bank came on up the river with in good breeze from the S by W took her to the wharf and made her fast At Home after Voyage of 33 months
