

Saturday July the 2th 1831

These 24 Hours Commences with Light winds from S.E. and at 1 the Harbor Boat struck and killed a Black fish the Starboard and waist Boat struck and Grand and at 2 P.M. Boiled her net so found these 24 Hours Lat by Obs 40:59 Long 45:52

Sunday July the 3th these 24 Hours Commences with Light winds from S.W. and at 3 A.M. we saw a Dead sperm Whale and at 5 took her along side and commenced cutting and at 10 got the Trice works under weigh & 2 sail in sight and at 5 spoke the Mary Ann of New London redress out and the Commod Perry near in sight of N. London so ended these 24 Hours Lat by Obs 40:38 Long 44:31

Monday July the 4th these 24 Hours Commences with light winds S.W. & sail in sight and at 9 finished Boiling and at 11 P.M. fell in with a wreck a Schooner the shipwreck of Newborn and found a Boat and went to her and caught Plenty of fish so ended these 24 Hours Lat by Obs 40:10 Long 43:46

Tuesday July the 5th 1831

These 24 Hours Commences with Light winds from S.W. at 1 spoke the ship Commod Perry and Penguin of New London and at 5 P.M. set the Saver & Schooner Steadon 1 sail in sight and at 10 saw 8 Ship steering on the wind so ended these 24 Hours Lat by Obs 40:04 Long 40:43

Wednesday July the 6th 1831
These 24 Hours Commences with Strong Breeze from S.W. first and Middle part specially saw several fin backs Whales and at 8 saw ~~the~~ sail steering E.S.E. so ended these 24 Hours Lat by Obs 39:43 Long 38:24

Thursday July the 7th 1831
These 24 Hours Commences with the wind North and at 4 the wind shifted to S.E. and at 5 P.M. the wind shifted to S.E. and at 10 spoke ship and stood to the Southward and Eastward so ended these 24 Hours Lat by Obs 39:10 Long 37:44
