

Wednesday July the 20<sup>th</sup> 1831

These 24 Hours Commences with Light winds from ESE and at 4 finished Boston Middle and later part Calm and at 11 P.M. Saw 10 sail to the windward saw plenty of Porpoises and Grampuses so ends these 24 Hours Set by Obs 39:40 Long 31:45

Thursday July the 21<sup>st</sup> 1831 these 24 Hours Commences with Light winds from ESE and at 4 the wind shifted to SE and at 5 stowed down the oil and at 8 the wind shifted to South and at 9 P.M. fired after Black fish and got 2 to the Starboard 1 to the Land 1 to the Starboard and at 5 P.M. saw the Land Flores the distance 10 Leagues so ends these 24 Hours Set by Obs 39:26

Friday July the 22<sup>nd</sup> 1831 these 24 Hours Commences with Light winds and at 3 saw after Black fish and got 10 5 to the Starboard and 2 to the Starboard and 3 to the west 3 sail in sight Middle part Calm and later part Light breeze from SSW so ends these 24 Hours Set by Obs 39:14 Long 31:40

Saturday July the 23<sup>rd</sup> 1831

These 24 Hours Commences with Light winds from SSW Several sail in sight and at 1 P.M. got the Trawl under weigh and at 8 saw 10 sail and at 9 spoke the Frank line of 16 masted 100 Spinn 10 Black fish so ends these 24 Hours Set by Obs 38:50

Sunday July the 24<sup>th</sup> 1831 these 24 Hours Commences with Light winds from SE Several sail in sight and at 8 finished sailing and at 4 took in sail and hove her and at 12 wore ship and at 4 P.M. spoke the ship Gasper of Boston and the Gallette of Forehaven so ends these 24 Hours

Monday July the 25<sup>th</sup> 1831 these 24 Hours Commences with Light winds from S W and at sunset Ashore to fly off and at 9 P.M. went Ashore and returned and at 11 P.M. saw 10 sail of the day spoke several ships so ends these 24 Hours
