Tuesday August the 10th 1831

These 24 Hours Commences fine weather  
And Strong Breeze from S<sup>W</sup> E  
And at 6 Took for Sail and have  
the ship to under Close Reef main  
Topsail and foresail and at 6 PM  
Saw the Land St Nicholas and  
St 12 North point Bearing South  
the Distance 8 leagues So Ends these  
24 Hours Employed in Ship Duty

Thursday August the 11th 1831

These 24 Hours Commences fine weather  
the S<sup>W</sup> E And at 4 PM spoke  
the Ship Louisa of New York  
and saw the land St Jago  
So Ends these 24 Hours at Jago  
S<sup>W</sup> E part Bearing South the Distance  
10 Miles Employed in Ship Duty
