

Thursday October the 20th 1831

First part of these 24 Hours Strong
Breeze Saw Several fin Backs
And at 6 Spoke the Ship Harbuck
of New London 1. Whale and at Sun
Down took in Sail Middle And
Latter Part some Squally And
At Day Light made Sail and
At 10 Saw a Brig to the windward
So Ended the Day Long 350

Friday October the 21st 1831
First part Strong Breeze And
Squally And at 2 Saw a
whale And toward But Did
Not get fast And at 3 Spoke the
Brig Potham of New Bedford
Capt. Hammon with 4 others
Now at Sun Down took in Sail
And Saw 3 whale And at Day
Light made Sail Latter part
Squally and at 10 Day of March
Ship to the windward So Ended these
24 Hours Letting off 36-24 Long 355

Saturday October the 22nd 1831

First part of these 24 Hours Good
weather And at 2 And 3 Saw 4 ships
Saw 1 or 2 whale And at 5 Spoke the
Ship Mentor of New London
And the ship of New Bedford 5
whale and at Sun Down took
in Sail And at Daylight made
Sail Several Ships in sight And
at 5 Saw a whale And toward
But Did not get fast And
Spoke the John Adams 4 boats
4 whale So Ended the Day
at 36-31 Long 400 West

Sunday October the 23rd 1831
First part of these 24 Hours
Good weather Several Ships
in sight Saw some Fin Backs
And at 5 Spoke the Ship Henry
of New Bedford And the ship
Mentor of New London 1 whale
And at Day Light made Sail Several sail
in sight Saw Great many of finbacks
So Ended the Day at 36-53 Long 3-15 East
