All These 24 Hours Good weather
Several Ships in Sight and at
9 Spoke the Ship Alexander Monro
of Hudson 1300 t^{ons} and the Tobacco
plant of New Bedford 1450 t^{ons}
So Ends No Lot this Day
Employed in Boiling Long 3-15

Wednesday November the 30th 1831
First part Good weather and at
4 Spoke the Ship George of Kent
2000 t^{ons} and at 4 Saw a whale But
Did Not get fat and finished Boiling
Middle and Latter part Strong
Breeze And finished Stowing
Down of Ends Several Sail in Sight
Lot by ab 34-50 Long 3-45

Thursday December the 1st 1831

All These 24 Hours Strong Breeze
3 Ships in Sight and at 4 Spoke
the Ship Neptune of Sag Harbor
1400 t^{ons} Saw some Finbacks Latter part
Strong Breeze and Foggy So Ends these
24 Hours No Lot this Day Long 3-55

Friday December the 2nd 1831
First And Middle part Light
Breeze And Foggy Latter part Good
weather 4 Ships in Sight Saw some
Finbacks So Ends Lot by ab 33-15 Long
Long by Larnometer 4-30

Saturday December the 3rd 1831
All These 24 Hours Good weather
And at 3 Spoke the Ship Hope of
New Bedford 200 t^{ons} Middle and
Latter part Calm So Ends
Lot by ab 32-05 Long 4-20
