First Part Strong Breeze And Druggin
And at 3 Spoke the Ship Minerva of
Newberford 2000th and at 4 Saw
3 whale Toward But did Not Get past
Middle part Strong Breeze latter
part Moderate 3 Ships in Sight So
Ends Lat By obs 33-52 Long 4-25

Sunday January the 8th 1832
First and Middle part Moderate
2 Ships in sight Latter part Fresh
Breeze So Windy there 24 Showers
Lat By obs 39-20 Longy 4-5-0

Tuesday January the 9th 1832
First part Fresh Breeze And
At 2 Spoke the Ship Meteor
of Hudson 1600 M And at Sun
Down Saw Several whale Middle
And Latter part Fresh Breeze
And foggy and at 10 Saw whales
Saw And the Sailed And went
out Struck And Killed And Lined
the want Bats to End 2 1/2 M 3946 L 5 10

Wednesday January the 10th 1834

First part some foggy, and at
12 Got the whale Longside and
cut her in and at 3 Saw whales
Loward and the Larkins and
Hast Boat Struck and the west
Boat Threw and at 6 Got them
Longside and at Day light cut
them in so Ends with foggy weather
No Lot this Day Long 5.00 Best
2 Sheep in Sight

Thursday January the 11th 1834
All these 24 hours Light winds
And Good weather Employed
in Boiling and at 4 Spoke
the Ship Departure of Sag
Harbour 22th So Ends
Ships in Sight Sat 13th 1834 52

Friday January the 12th 1832
All these 24 hours foggy weather
3 Ships in Sight Latter part
Strong Breeze 1 Ship in Sight Employed
in Stowing down to Board Ho. Sat
this Day Sailing 5⁰⁰ West
