First And Middle part Morning
And at 1 Commenced Cutting And
at 2 Spoke the ship passed of
Bottom 2350 At latter part
Fresh Breeze So Ends Employed
in Boiling And Stowing Down
Lat by us 40 41 Long 42 5

Thursday January the 19th 1832
All these 24 hours Strong Breeze
And foggy Saw Nothing
Employed in Boiling and
Stowing Down Lat by us this
Day Long 4 30 West

Friday January the 20th 1832
All these 24 hours A Gail of
Wind And at Sun Down finished
Boiling and at Daylight
Saw 2 ships So Ends Lat by us
41 00 Long 4 40 West

Saturday January the 21st 1832

First part Strong Breeze And Squally
2 ships in Sight Middle And latter
part Light Breezes Nothing in
Sight So Ends Employed in Stow-
ing Down Lat by us
40 49 Long 4 30 West

Sunday January the 22nd 1832
All these 24 hours Light winds
with some squalls Saw 1 ship
Steering to the Eastward So Ends
these 24 hours Lat by us
40 40 Long 4 35 West

Monday January the 23rd 1832
First part Light winds Saw
3 whale Going Duck Middle
part Squally latter part Saw
5 whale forward And the
Latter Boat Struck And then
went back Thiked And at
12 Got her Longside So Ends
Lat by us 40 12 Long 4 40
