 SSF These 24 hours commence with fine weather at 3 o'clock rose a breach a long distance off at 4 came up them and lowered three was 5 or 6 of them and going to windward as fast as a boat can pull we lowered but of no use
 Middle the same
 Latter part strong breeze and squally at 3 o'clock saw a large school of sperm whales as we catch them going to leeward faster than ever a ship or boat could think of going also saw one or two sails

 SSF These 24 hours commence a strong breeze saw nothing but the land East and West
 Middle part fine weather
 Latter part fine weather saw nothing but a ship and Barque to a distance we exchange signals with the ship she is English land in sight both sides we have two men sick
 S.W. 20 S.E. 5

W. H. G. C. W. I. Remarks Tuesday 14th
 SSF These 24 hours commence with fine weather and a light breeze saw two whals near the sunshade a long distance of run for them but saw no more of them also saw the same sails and land the sick men are no better
 Middle part strong breeze and rain squalls
 Latter part light breeze and thick squally weather saw nothing

W. H. G. C. W. I. Remarks Wednesday 15th
 SSF These 24 hours commence with a light baffling wind thick and rainy saw nothing but the Ile of France to the Eastward of us about 25 miles distant
 Middle part light air and thick weather
 Latter part calm saw nothing but a few porpoises the of France about 20 miles distant
