

Remarks Onboard Ship Abelilla May 1850
H H F C W I Remarks Thursday 16th.

2 These 24 hours commence with calms
at 4 o'clock take a light breeze just before
sundown rose 3 or 4 storm whales and
lowered for them but too late to do any thing
or rather the boatstaver missed one
Middle part light airs and calms
SE
Latter part strong breeze with a
heavy squall saw one or two breads
run for them but saw them no
more. Land about the same distance
we have a heavy swell from S

H H F C W I Remarks Friday 17th

2 These 24 hours commence with light
breeze and a heavy swell saw
nothing but the land and one sail
to a distance
Middle part calms and squalls of
wind and rain from all quarters
NW
Latter part light air from NW
saw nothing but one or two schooners
in shore from as our cooper is no
better he is very sick the land
about 6 miles distant with a very heavy
swell from S

H H F C W I Remarks Saturday 18th

1 These 24 hours commence with a light
breeze saw nothing trying to get up
to port Louis saw nothing but the
same sails
Middle part fine weather
NW
Latter part strong breeze bedding
along shore towards the port saw
saw three or four ships and schooners
to a distance from 4 to 10 miles off
Sept 11 1850
Jan 27 1850

At the Ste. de France
H H F C W I Remarks Sunday 19th

2 These 24 hours commence with fine
weather and a light breeze at sundown
got near enough to see the ships at anchor
from West head
Middle part strong breeze and squally
Latter part strong breeze at 10 o'clock drop anchor
at port Louis we fire 15 or 20 salts here mostly
pencks and english merchantmen no whale
ships we are boarded by the health officer
government doctor &c. the Capt goes on shore in
a shore boat

H H F C W I Remarks Monday 20th

2 These 24 hours commence with fine weather
a light breeze the Capt and doctor came on board
to see the cooper and prescribe medicine &c
also receive 1 ton of gums from on shore and send
the boat for the Capt and two men deserted
Middle part fine weather the boat comes back
but the Capt stays all night
Latter part fine weather send a boat
on shore and get a few potatoes and fresh
beef &c. our cooper is gaining the rest of
believe are well

H H F C W I Remarks Tuesday 21st

2 These 24 hours commence with fine weather
take on board 2 tons of potatoes &c at sundown
the Capt came on board with three men that
he had shipped in the room of the two deserters
on his arrival we take our anchor and go
to sea
Middle part fine weather
Latter part same rain & squalls we
are now on the ground again but
nothing in sight yet but the
land about 30 miles distant
