H K F C W S Remarks Thursday 9th

2 These 24 hours commence with a calm
4 saw a plenty of blackfish the other ship
6 for them but of no use also saw the same
8 Islands
10 Middle part squally with some rain
12 the Capt of the English came onboard for
2 a short time
4 Latter part light breeze and fine weather
6 the Capt went onboard of the other ship
8 and spent the day saw some small
10 Islands and two other sails to a
12 distance and the men is quite unwell

H K F C W S Remarks Friday 10th

2 These 24 hours commence with calms
4 and squalls of wind and rain saw
6 nothing the Capt came onboard at
8 sundown the Barque then went on the
10 opposite tack
12 Middle part calms and rain squalls
2 Latter part light air saw a Barque
4 astern a merchantman and another
6 said ahead also saw the Island
8 of Syang and one or two more small
10 Islands bearing S E from us also
12 saw a plenty of porpoises

H K F C W S Remarks Saturday 11th

2 These 24 hours commence with a light
4 breeze and considerable swell from
6 North saw the same two sails and
8 land just in sight our sick man
10 is no better
12 Middle part strong breeze thick and
2 raining
4 Latter part light wind and cloudy
6 saw one ship to windward as far could
8 be seen saw nothing else once
10 more out of sight of land all sail set 8
12 Sept 1 18 1/2

H K F C W S Remarks Sunday 12th

2 These 24 hours commence with a light
4 breeze and thick weather saw nothing
6 our sick man appears to have a Syphilis
8 fever is quite sick
10 Middle part strong winds and calms
12 with a plenty of rain and a heavy swell
2 Latter part light wind and a steady rain
4 saw and spoke and English merchant
6 Barque called the Bangover 36 days from
8 Rio de Janeiro to Canton 88
10 No W. quest Sept 18 12 1/2
12 Jan 130 24 1/2

H K F C W S Remarks Monday 13th

2 These 24 hours commence with a light wind
4 and rainy saw nothing but the same
6 barque astern took the sick man into the cabin
8 Middle strong breeze and raining at one
10 clock took the fore topmast standing sail
12 and main royal
2 Latter moderate thick weather at the
4 standing sail again saw nothing but
6 the barque to leeward the sick man
8 appears to be a failing we have some
10 rain washed the steeple anchor on the bow
12 Sept 19 38 1/2

H K F C W S Remarks Tuesday 14th

2 These 24 hours commence with moderate weather thick and
4 some rainy at 2 o'clock saw a school of sperm whales lowered the larder
6 stuck a small one and while fast to him a bow whale came up under the boat
8 and struck very bad the mast but got fast to him and killed him then cut the line
10 to strike another and he sunk him and all so we got nothing
12 Middle part moderate weather and cloudy steer the same and
2 wind North at 4 o'clock At St Francis Silva our sick man
4 breathed his last without a struggle after 10 days sickness only
6 Latter part light breeze with heavy squalls of wind and rain
8 saw nothing but the barque to leeward at 11 o'clock At St
10 buried the corps with reading a chapter in the bible
12 by Chronometer Sept 2 34 1/2
