

Remarks Onboard Ship Arabella Feb 14th 1851
H H J C W S

These 24 hours commence with fine weather employed in setting up stocks and other stales duty
Middle strong breeze and rainy
 Latter part strong winds and squally employed in setting up stocks scraping ship &c as the calkers have finished calking

H H J C W S Remarks Saturday 15th

These 24 hours commence with strong winds and rainy employed in ships duty let the harbor wack go onshore for the evening
Middle part moderate but foggy
 Latter part fine weather let the harbor wack go onshore on liberty for 24 hours

H H J C W S Remarks Sunday 16th

These 24 hours commence with fine weather the wack still onshore
Middle part fine weather
 Latter part strong breeze and rainy two of the wack did not get off on board until 11 o'clock then brought by the police men also took on board 80 barrels of beef and 10 of pork from shore

H H J C W S Hong Kong Feb 17th 1851
Remarks Monday 17th

These 24 hours commence with moderate thick weather employed in storing down the meat and other ships duty also take on board 6 tons of coal
Middle part the same
 Latter part rainy and moderate employed in setting up stocks again for water

H H J C W S Remarks Tuesday 18th

These 24 hours commence with thick cloudy weather employed in scraping ship and storing away coal &c the harbor wack onshore for the evening
Middle part the same
 Latter part thick rainy weather finish setting up stocks and storing away coal &c

H H J C W S Remarks Wednesday 19th

These 24 hours commence with thick weather took on board from a water boat 10 tons of water &c
Middle part the same
 Latter part thick weather employed in blacking the bonds &c the harbor wack goes onshore on liberty for 24 hours
