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H K J C W S Remarks Tuesday 3rd

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These 24 hours commence with a light air and thick fog saw nothing but the men forward got to fighting. St. Paris and Manuel, Francis Paris has got his eyes badly blacked the Capt. tied their left hands together and gave each a piece of rope but they would not use them so he gave them six lashes each with a piece of three worm line

Middle part the same

Later part light breeze and snow saw a plenty of ships to a distance in every direction

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H K J C W S Remarks Wednesday 4th

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These 24 hours commence with light breeze and foggy six ships came together namely Sagwa General Pike San Jose America and only they have all seen the ice to day

Middle part the same

Later part strong breeze saw a plenty of ships were in as near the land as ice will allow about 12 miles and lowered two boats and went in as far as they could get saw 4 or 5 California Grays among the ice cloudy weather

H K J C W S Remarks Thursday 5th

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These 24 hours commence with a light breeze and fine weather but today saw nothing but ships saw at one time from off deck 148 sails 16 whales and two looking for Sir John Franklin

Middle part the same

Later part light breeze and thick weather saw nothing but the land ships 4 or 5 of them went into the ice as far as they could get and dropped anchor as the ice appears to be coming off from the land
