2 These 24 hours commence with a

H. H. G. C. W. I. Remarks Saturday 21st

2 These 24 hours commence with a strong
4 breeze, and raining, saw nothing but ice
6 until 7 o'clock then let up saw 19 ships
8 but none very near
10 Middle part the same saw 2 ships cutting
12 in a whale with a signal set and histing
2 up and down run down to her the Robert Edwards
4 she wanted a little information in regard to
6 cutting so Capt. Appleton went aboard from her
8 Latter part light and fine pleasant weather
10 saw one or two humpbacks and a plenty of
12 ships and a plenty of ice &c the land

H. H. G. C. W. I. Remarks Sunday 22nd

2 These 24 hours commence with a light
4 air and calm, saw one or two humpbacks
6 but going eyes out also saw a plenty of
8 ships ice and layd to the North saw
10 three ships a sailing
12 Middle part strong breeze at one clock
2 saw two humpbacks and took them to be
4 Bonapartes and lowered one boat
6 Latter part strong wind and rugged saw
8 nothing but a plenty of ice and about
10 twenty ships two of them sailing
12

2 These 24 hours commence with a strong
4 wind and rugged sea nothing orign spoke
6 the ship Pacific left Nore New Bedford
8 he came on board and got his letters under
10 double reef topsails &c
12 Middle part the same
2 Latter part strong and rugged with
4 some fog saw nothing but one
6 humpback and a few ships and ice
8 make some sail

H. H. G. C. W. I. Remarks Tuesday 24th

2 These 24 hours commence with more
4 moderate weather but cloudy saw nothing
6 but ships and killers one humpback &c
8 all sail set
10 Middle part the same
12 Latter part fine weather saw nothing
2 but three ships and some killers under
4 a short sail lay the most of the
6 time with the grain yard aback
8

H. H. G. C. W. I. Remarks Wednesday 25th

2 These 24 hours commence with light
4 air and calm saw one whale and
6 lowered but saw him no more
8 employed in mending the St. J. sail
10 also saw three ships one of them sailing
12 Middle part foggy with a light air saw
2 one whale and lowered one but chased him
4 six or eight miles but of no use
6 Latter part light and clear saw two
8 or three whales and lowered twice but
10 could not overtake them saw six or eight
12 ships one of them sailing also saw the land
