

Tuesday Sept the 7 1847
The Day begins with moderate breezes and pleasant weather all hands employed in Ship's Duty Ship Hohe in Light latter part moderate at 10 am spoke the Schooner Splendid of New York Lat 39° 34' S Long 62° 00'

Wednesday the 8 1847 first part moderate breezes and pleasant weather latter part strong breezes from S by E Ship heading to the Eastward Lat 38° 24' S North

Thursday the 9 1847
Through the Day strong breezes from East Ship heading to the South and Eastward No Obs to Day

Friday the 10 1847
the Day begins with strong breezes from E by S Ship heading to S by E latter part strong gales Lat 38° 28' Long 55° 28' west

Saturday Sept the 11 1847
The Day begins with strong gales from East Ship heading S by E latter part more moderate made Sail Lat 39° 39' S

Sunday Sept the 12 1847
the Day begins with strong gales from S by E Ship heading S by E at 8 pm take in the jib and main Sail and Spander a heavy sea running from the East latter part how too under fore topsails stay Sail and main Spenceer wind how blowing very heavy S from S by E Ship heading to the S by E striking more remarkable Lat by obs 40° 9' S

Monday Sept the 13 1847
the Day begins with heavy gales from South with a heavy swell running at 7 pm the gale abated none Ship and stood to the Eastward latter part moderate made all Sail Lat 39° 58' S Long 52° 24' west

Tuesday Sept the 14 1847
the Day begins with moderate breezes and pleasant weather wind from S by E Course E by S latter part unpleasant no obs

Wednesday Sept the 15 1847
the Day begins with fine breezes and pleasant weather the watch employed in Ship's Duty wind from S by E Ship heading E by S by the wind latter part moderate breezes and pleasant weather employed in the Duty of the Ship Lat 40° 46' S Long 47° 54' west

Thursday Sept the 16 1847
the Day begins with moderate breezes from S by E weather pleasant Ship heading to the North and Eastward at 1 pm saw 2 Sails to South and Westward latter part light breezes from S by E Ship heading E by S Lat 41° 44' S Long

Friday Sept the 17 1847
first part moderate breezes and pleasant weather wind from S by E at 1 1/2 pm tacked to S by E spoke the Schooner Bremen latter part moderate breezes from S by E Ship heading to South west many Sail in Light spoke a french brig from New York Lat 41° 16' S Long 46° 47'
