

Saturday Sept 18 1847

Through the day light airs from ESE and pleasant weather all hands employed in ship out Lat 39° 44' N Long 47° 02' west

Sunday Sept 19 1847

the day begins with light airs from SE by S light heading to the S.W. latter part calm and pleasant weather Lat by obs 38° 44' North

Monday Sept 20 1847

the day begins with light airs from west S.W. Gause ESE latter part pleasant breezes from North ship heading ESE Lat 38° 09' Long 48° 51'

Tuesday Sept 21 1847

first part moderate breezes and pleasant weather all hands employed in ship out latter part calm Lat 38° 09' N

Wednesday Sept 22 1847

first part calm latter part strong breezes from South ship heading ESE weather Lat 38° 07' N Long 40° 49' west

Thursday Sept 23 1847 23 out

Through the day strong breezes from S.W. ship heading SE by E a sail in light to windward Lat 37° 27' N

Friday Sept 24 1847

Through the day light airs from SE wind and pleasant weather Lat 37° 27' Long 35° 25'

Saturday Sept 25 1847 25

first part moderate breezes and pleasant weather wind from SE ship heading SW latter part light airs from S.W. Lat 36° 50' N

Sunday Sept 26 1847

all these 24 hours moderate breezes from S.W. ship heading SE by S weather pleasant but no whales Lat 36° 11' N Long 34° 27' west at 11 1/2 Am Albert Brown took the order of the ship fishing

Monday Sept 27 1847 27 out first part pleasant breezes from S.W. with pleasant weather and he Albert Brown I was in my presence on the quarter deck I had his hand tied in the shroud rigging for a half a hour and let him go he said that there was 12 men ready to back him in his Senape latter part strong breezes from S ship heading SE by E 800 whales Lat 34° 22' Long 32° 08' West

Tuesday Sept 28 1847

first part strong breezes and cloudy weather latter part moderate breezes and pleasant weather at 6 1/2 Am I saw sperm whales at 8 commenced struck 3 and at 11 took the whales to the ship at Lat 32° 36' N Long 20° 15' W

Wednesday Sept 29 1847 at 2 Am commenced cutting out 6 finished at 8 got tea and set the watch latter part employed bailing strong breezes from S.E. ship heading S Lat 30° 8' N Long 30° 30' west

Thursday Sept 30 1847

Through day light breezes from ESE at 11 Am finished bailing and made sail Lat 27° 23' North

Friday Sept 1 1847

first part moderate breezes from ESE ship heading S by W latter part calm employed clearing ship Lat 27° 57' Long 30° 44' 30 74

and refuse to obey the orders of the ship
