

Sunday Oct 31st 1847

The day begins with strong breezes from S by E
Course S by W 1 Ship in sight to the Seeward
Latter part moderate at 11 Am Saw 1 sperm
whales and lowered 4 boats for and the day.

Monday Nov 1st 1847

at 12³⁰ the west boat struck and got badly stove
and lost the whale at 1. On the Wabau and
and Landard boats struck Landard & cut
the line and struck again at 2³⁰ the
Stauband boat the whale to ship and struck
Landard & whale with and took him to
the ship Landard and boats in Chaise
of the whales to the Seeward at 4 Am out all
sight from the ship at 4 Am heeled up and
ruin till 8 and took in sail at 11 Am the
Landard & Course on board at 6³⁰ begins
Cut at 10 Am the bow boat got on board
after being gone from the ship 18 hours at 11
finished cutting all made ship Lat 36 miles South

 Tuesday Oct 2nd 1847

The day begins with moderate breezes and pleasant
weather at 2 Am Commence boiling Latter
part the same No obs to day

Wednesday 3rd Oct 1847

Though the day strong breezes from S by E
Course by the wind Lat 4¹¹ 39 S Long 27¹¹ 55

Thursday Oct 4th 1847

all these 24 hours strong breezes from
S by E Course S by W at 6 Am Saw a sail
had passed her Lat 6⁵⁵ South

Friday Nov 5th 1847

Though the day strong breezes from
S by E Lat 9⁴¹ S Long 30¹⁰ west

Saturday Oct 6th 1847

first part strong breezes from S by E
Course S by W Latter part moderate breezes
pleasant weather Course S by W no whales
Lat 12³¹ S Long 31³⁷ west

Sunday Nov 7th 1847

first part strong breezes from S by E Course
S by W Latter part strong breezes from
S by E Course S by W Lat 15³¹ S

Monday Nov 8th 1847

all these 24 hours strong breezes from East
with pleasant weather the Seeward Pick
up off boat Lat 15⁴⁴ S Long 34⁵⁵ W

Tuesday Nov 9th 1847

Though the day strong breezes North
Ship heading S by W weather pleasant
all hands employed in Ship's duty
Lat 21²⁰ S Long 34⁵⁶ west

Wednesday Oct 10th 1847

first part strong breezes from North
Ship steering S by W Latter part wind
hailed to the S and rainy weather
Lat 22⁴¹ S

Thursday Nov 11th 1847

first part equally weather Latter
part pleasant weather wind from S by E
Course S by W Lat 23³⁸ S Long 34¹⁵ west

Friday Nov 12th 1847

Though the day light breezes from S by E
with pleasant weather Saw many birds
at 810 sperm whales

Lat by obs 25²² South
