

Thursday Jan 20 1848
through the bay moderate breezes and pleasant
weather but no whales. Lat 20°29' Long 85°28'
Friday Jan 21 1848
first part fine weather at 3 pm Saw
Sperm whales lowered 3 boats at 4 PM
a small whale & took him to the ship
Latter part employed boiling
Lat 19°39' South

Saturday Jan 22nd 1848
first part employed boiling at 9 pm Saw
Herd Island at 3 pm Saw Chatham Id
bearing N by E 1/2 E. Latter part Saw Charles
Island bearing N by E Lat 19°29' South

Sunday Jan 23rd 1848 Ad
first part fine weather Saw Black Fish
Charles Island bearing N Lat 25 miles
Latter part Light airs Land in sight Charles
Island bearing N by E Lat 30 miles Lat 19°28' S
Monday

Tuesday Jan 24 1848
first part Calm middle part moderate
breezes from S by E Ship heading in for the Land
Latter part sent in 2 boats to get
Tanner Ship Laying off and on of South
Head the Island of Abemone. So ends the day

Wednesday Jan 25th 1848
first part Spent in Tanning at 4 pm
the boats returned on board with 2 Line
Tanning and 3 keels one after being gone
1 1/2 hours from the ship brought 6 from
the Repton of Cabbas. Latter
part Steering off from the Land
for the off shore
Lat 19°03' South

Thursday Jan 26 1848
first part Calm and Cloudy weather Latter
part moderate breezes from S by E Ship heading
to the S by E Saw a fine back Lat 19°04' S

Friday Jan 27 1848
this begins with fine weather and pleasant breezes
from South Ship seeing N by E by the wind
Latter part Saw Black fish and got 4 of
them the water employed in the bulge of the
Ship Lat 18°54' miles South

Saturday January 28th 1848
first part of the 24 hours Light airs and fine
weather at 4 pm put Boy John in the rigging
and placed him for taking a line to boat
at me and put him in Irons and put him
in the name as I thought him an Irish or Irish
Boy. Latter part Light airs from S by E
Saw Black fish no obs to say

Sunday Jan 29 1848
all these 24 hours Calm but the cutting
pendens over the mast head and put
some Sperm down in between keels
and hoisted out some black fish blubber
Lat 18°13' S Long 95°27' west

Monday Jan 30th 1848
first part Calm Latter part moderate
breezes from S by E at 9 am Saw Sperm
whales lowered all the boats and
knuck 3 So ends the day 8 o'clock to Long
Tuesday Jan 31 1848
the whales to the ship and at 4 o'clock cutting
at 8 pm Latter part employed boiling
Lat 31 miles South 1848
