Monday Feb 7 1848
first part Light airs Latter
part Employed Stowing down oil
in the main hatch way Lat 00th 40

Tuesday Feb 8 1848
all these 24 hours Light airs and pleasant
weather Employed Stowing down oil in the
main hatch way Lat 00th 00

Wednesday February 9th 1848
Through the day Calm all hands Employed
Coppering bread and Flour 8th abs to bay

Thursday Feb 10th 1848
Through the day Calm Employed Coppering
bread but no whales Lat 26 S Long 105th 9

Friday Feb 11th 1848
Through the day Calm Employed Coppering
bread and Flour Lat 24 S Long 106th 25

Saturday Feb 12 1848
Through the day Light airs and pleasant
weather all hands Employed Cleaning ship
2 men taken off of duty Lat 5 miles S

Sunday Feb 13 1848
first part a moderate breeze from S S E
middle part Calm Latter part and evening
breeze from S S Lat 24 S Long 105th 32

Monday Feb 14 1848
first part a moderate and fine weather
Latter part Calm and no whales
Lat 38 S Long 105th 20 west

Tuesday Feb 15 1848
Through day Light airs from S W
Lat 44 miles S

Wednesday Feb 16 1848
Through the day Calm and no whales
Lat 42 miles South
