Tuesday march 7 1848

S & E Ship heading N.W. Lat 14° 6' 8'

Wednesday march 8 1848
all these 24 hours pleasant weather
Course N.W. Lat 4° 19' 8' Long 134° 34'

Thursday march 9th 1848
first part pleasant breezes from S & E
Course N.W. Latter part Squally
weather with rain wind from East
8° 0' Obs to Day

Friday march 10 1848
first part Squally weather wind
from S & E Latter part very
much the same Lat 8° 0' Obs to Day

Saturday march 11 1848
first part Squally weather wind
from S & E to S E Course N.W. Latter
part very much the same
Lat 10° 14' 8' Long 136° 00' West

Sunday march 12 1848
first part Squally weather with rain
at our table the trades wind's from
S & E Course N.W. 8° 0' Obs to Day

Monday march 13 1848
first part Strong breezes and Cloudy
weather Saw five hump whales Latter
part fresh trade and Cloudy weather
Lat 13° 19' 8'

Tuesday march 14 1848
first part moderate trades from East
Latter part light breezes and baffling
8° 0' Obs to Day

Wednesday march 15 1848
all these 24 hours Strong trades and
Cloudy weather Lat 16° 24' Long 146° 00' W

Thursday march 16 1848
Through the day Strong breezes from S & E
Course West by S Lat 17° Long 149° 30'

Friday march 18 1848
all these 24 hours Strong trades with
Cloudy weather Ship steering N.W. by
Compass Lat 18° 33' 8' Long 153° 46' W

Saturday march 19 1848
first part Strong breezes from S & E
Ship heading N.W. by Compass Latter part
Course West & S at 5 AM the Land
East point of bearing N.W. by S
dist 20 miles at our gate in under
Land So End the Day

Sunday march 20 1848
Through the day Calm Ship under the lee
of a large 1st Ship in sight 8° 0' whales
