begins to bail. Last part
rainy weather and so forth.

Sunday May 28 1848
first part strong gales from NW
with rain at Employed Cutting
and Bailing at 3 pm finish the body
and Cal'd down. Latter part moderate
and cloudy weather at 4 1/2 Commence
bailing and take in the head 8 1/2 abs

Monday May 29 1848
begins with strong gales from 81 to 87 E
Employed bailing middle part rainy
Latter part Employed bailing heavy
gales with rain wind hauled to the
SE 1/4 no abs to day

Tuesday May 30 1848
first part strong breezes and rainy
Employed bailing Latter part heavy
rain and fresh breezes so ends day

Wednesday May 31 1848
first part strong breezes and rainy
Employed bailing at 5 pm finish
bailing Latter part fine breezes
and cloudy weather wind from 8m
Lat 32 1/2 23 81 Long 169 1/6 East

Thursday June 1 1848
Through the day moderate breezes
foggy weather 8 1/2 Dings of Whales
Lat 31 1/4 43 82

Friday June 2 1848
first part moderate breezes and pleasant
weather Latter part foggy wind from
from 9 1/2 m Lat 31 1/4 47 Long 169 3/4 E

Saturday June 3 1848
Through the day moderate breezes and foggy
weather wind from full quarters 8 1/2 abs to day

Sunday June 4 1848
first part pleasant weather Ship
heading to the westward Latter part
the same at 11 1/2 am Saw 1 sperm
Whales and Lawrence so ends the day Lat 31 1/2 42



Monday June 5 1848
first part Employed in Chase of Whales
at 4 am the Staboard boat struck
a large whale and killed him. Laid
boat fast to another and last his
line at 4 1/2 am Commence towing and at
16 1/2 04 4 am take the whale to ship at 8 began
to cut at 12 finished Cutting Lat 31 1/4 43

Tuesday June the 6 1848
Commence with strong breezes with
rain all night Employed in getting
to bail at 3 1/2 pm Saw 1 sperm whales
going quickly Laid out without success
Latter part Employed bailing
Lat 31 1/2 46 Long 169 1/2 +

Wednesday 7 1848
Through the day Employed bailing
strong breezes with rain Lat 30 38
