

Sunday July 16 1848
all the 24 hours fresh breezes from S.E.
Ship heading to westward Lat 31°01' S

Monday July 17 1848
Through the Day Light breezes
at 7 AM Spoke Ship & anagones
of Stentope 21 months and 2.50 sperm
raggers mounter Lat 31°44'

Tuesday July 18 1848
Through the Day Light breezes and
pleasant weather 24 lines of whales
Lat 31°55' S Long

Wednesday 19 July 1848
Through the Day moderate breezes
and pleasant weather Ship heading
Southward Lat 30°55' S

Thursday July 20 1848
first part moderate breezes
and fine weather latter part
at 11 AM Sperm whales and 2 lower



Friday July 21 1848
the day begins with fine weather
boats in chase of the whales
at 2 AM the L.B. and M.B. and
K.B. boats all got fast and at
3 AM take one of the whales to the
Ship and at 6 AM take other 2 whales
along side and take in side for the
right at 5 AM begin to cut at 10
finished cutting 2 of the whales
and commence cleaning away
the blubber Lat 30°37' S

Saturday July 22 1848
the day begins with strong breezes
breezes and pleasant weather at 1 PM
begin to cut at 3 1/2 finished at 6
commence bailing latter part
employed bailing and cleaning away the
blubber Lat 30°42' S

Sunday July 23 1848
Through the Day strong breezes
Employed bailing Lat 30°20' S

Monday July 24 1848
all the 24 hours Employed bailing
and saw fine blubber Lat 31°15'

Tuesday July 25 1848
first part Employed bailing
at 4 PM finished Em bailing
latter part Employed washing
of Lat 30°30' Long 169°01'

Wednesday
Monday July 26 1848
Through the Day Light breezes
and fine weather at 7 AM begin to
clean Lat 30°23'

Thursday July 27 1848
Through the Day Employed Stowing
down oil in the main hatch
fine weather Lat 30°40'

Friday July 28 1848
Through the Day Light breezes
at 10 AM finished Stowing
down oil and commence
cleaning Ship Lat 30°30' S
