Through the day light breezes Ship
heading to the Eastward Lat 30 46

Saturday Aug 19 1848
all the day light breezes from
S.E. Ship heading to the Eastward one
mile to the South Lat 31 28 S 173 22

Sunday Aug 20 1848
first part moderate breezes at
4 AM Spoke the Tobacco plant Capt
Allen Later part generally weather
A 2 Ships in sight 31 29 S

Monday Aug 21 1848
Through the day light airs
and pleasant weather 2 Ships
in sight Lat 31 42
Long 174 01 E

Tuesday Aug 22 1848
first part Employed in Capenue
+ meat at 1 1/2 PM Saw sperm whales
Landed all the boats in choir
up them at 2 1/2 PM the Landed
most boat paston but the Iron
blew and lost the whale at
4 1/2 PM Starboard Boat struck
along whale and kill him at 6 1/2
the Bow Boat paston and lost
the line at 7 took the whale
to the Ship and hauled in for
from the sight a mis. whale



Tuesday Aug 22 1848
Through the day moderate
breezes from S.E. Ship heading
to the S.E. Lat 32 10 S Long 174 20

Wednesday Aug 23 1848
first part light airs and pleasant
weather Employed Capenue the meat
+ at 1 1/2 PM Saw sperm whales and
Landed all boats the most boat
paston to along whale and blew
at 4 1/2 PM the S. Boat struck
along whale and kill him at 7
took him to Ship at 5 1/2 PM struck
and lost his line at 6 1/2 Commence
Cutting at 6 AM Saw more
whales did not lower as we
was mated with Ship Howard
at 10 finished Cutting at 11 1/2 AM
hoisted the Head and 1 small
blanket piece to the to the mate
of Ship Howard Capt Kunkler
Starboard Lat 32 24 S
