heading to the SE latter part more
moderate at Jan a fair to the South
Lat 2° 12' S Long 177° 20' E

Wednesday 27 1848
first part strong breezes from
SW Ship heading to the westward
at 5 AM spoke the Ship Robie
of Manzan 37 months out 800 Sperm
latter part spoke Ship Elizabeth
of New Bedford Baker master 14th men
430 Sperm hake Island in sight
So ends the day SW abt

Thursday 28 1848
first part moderate breezes and
fine weather a Ship in sight to
the SW latter part Jan & fair
Lat 2° 26' S

Y Friday Dec 29 1848
Through the day calm 2 Ships in
sight at 4½ AM saw Sperm whales
6 mounds off Lander & boats without
success Lat part moderate breezes
from SE Lat 2° 04' S South

Saturday Dec 30 1848
first part moderate breezes and fine
weather but no whales latter part
moderate breezes at 2 PM spoke Ship
Elizabeth Baker of New Bedford
Lat 1° 57' S Long 178° 15' E By Chron 177 30

Through the day moderate
winds from SE Ship & in sight
Lat 2° 56' S

Monday Jan 1 1849 Abt
Through the day light airs from SE
Ship & in sight Lat 2° 56' S

Tuesday Jan 2 1849
first part squally weather latter
part calm and fine weather
Ship & in sight at 5 AM unaccount
fore top sail to repair Lat 2° 22' S 178° 55'

Wednesday Jan 3 1849
Through the day light* airs from
SE Lat 2° 22' Long 178° 16' E

Thursday Jan 4 1849
Through the day squally weather
Ship & in sight 8° abt to day

Y Friday Jan 5 1849
Through the day moderate breezes
and fine weather saw the Ship
& among whales Lat 1° 49' S

Saturday Jan 6 1849
Through the day moderate breezes
with squalls at 4½ PM spoke
Ship & Lat 1° 28' 177° 26' E

Sunday Jan 7 1848
Through the day moderate breezes and
fine weather lat 8° whales
at 10 AM made byrons Island
to westward Lat 1° 28' 177° 26'

Monday Jan 8 1848
all the 24 hours moderate
breezes and fine weather Ship head
to S Lat 2° 57' S Long 178° 45' E
