 Through the day Squally weather  
 at 12 1/2 pm Spoke Ship Hector  
 South New Bedford 8 months out 260  
 Spenn all well Lat 3° 40' S Long 173° 40' E

Monday Feb 12 1849  
 first part Squally weather latter  
 part fine at 7 Am Spoke the Ship  
 Abigail amongst whales at 11 lowered  
 3 boats water with it at noon 3 boats  
 got part taken the whales to Ship  
 A whale Ship in chase of the  
 the whales Lat 2° 3' S Long 173° 01' E



Tuesday Feb 13 1849  
 at 7 pm gave up the chase  
 and returned to it at 8 Am  
 the wind away to very light breezes  
 Lat 2° 03' S Long 173° 01' E

Wednesday Feb 14 1849  
 at 8 took 1 of the whales to  
 the Ship and cut him in at 7  
 begins to bail Lat 2° 00' S Long 172° 58' E

Thursday Feb 15 1849  
 first part Employed breaming  
 out the fore hatch way latter part  
 Employed taking the ground Casks  
 and Coasting air to show down on  
 the Mainboard side of fore  
 hatch way latter part  
 the same Lat 1° 40' S Long 171° 51' E

Friday Feb 16 1849  
 all the 24 hours moderate  
 breezes and fine weather Lat 1° 28' S

Saturday Feb 17 1849  
 Through the day Light airs from  
 the Eastward with fine weather  
 Lat 2° 27' S Long 173° 30' E

Sunday Feb 18 1849  
 Through the day moderate breezes  
 and fine weather Lat 2° 30' S Long 174° 20' E

Monday Feb 19 1849  
 Through the day moderate winds  
 from ESE Ship heading to ESE  
 Lat 2° 51' S Long 174° 50' E

Tuesday Feb 20 1849  
 first part moderate breezes and  
 fine weather at 7 Spoke Ship  
 Abigail went on board and spent  
 the evening latter part strong  
 breezes fine weather Lat 2° 11' S

Wednesday Feb 21 1849  
 Through the day moderate breezes  
 and fine weather and 8 or 9 whales  
 Lat 2° 10' S Long 173° 50' E

Thursday Feb 22 1849  
 all the 24 hours moderate  
 breezes fine weather Ship Abigail  
 in company Lat 1° 40' S Long 173° 21' E

Friday Feb 23 1849  
 first part moderate breezes  
 and fine weather latter part  
 much the same at 7 Am Spoke  
 Ship Abigail among whales lower  
 2 boats without success  
 Lat 2° 10' S Long
