

Y Saturday Feb 24 1849
first part fine breezes and pleasant
weather at 2 pm the boats returned
on board whales came out of sight to
the windward. So ended the day 2nd 10 S

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Sunday Feb 25 1849
first part moderate breezes and
fine weather at 2 pm the boats returned
on board at 4 1/2 pm saw many whales
Landed 3 boats the Bow Boat had
a good chance at the whale and lost
him by the Boat Steamer missing him
Lat 20° 1' S Long 172° 30' E

Y Monday 26 1849
through the day moderate breezes
weather Lat 19° 13' Long 171° 25' E

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Tuesday Feb 27 1849
first part fine breezes and
pleasant weather at 3 pm
saw sperm whales at 2 Landed
I struck 1 to each ship at 7
wake the whale to ship and made
all part for the right at 5 1/2 am
began to cast at 7 pmish casting
and made sail at 10 began to
bail Lat 19° 25' Long 170° 51' E

Wednesday 28 1849
through the day employed
bailing Lat 19° 42' Long 170° 42'

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Thursday March 1 1849
all the day moderate breezes and
fine weather at 2 1/2 pm saw
1 sperm whale going much to wind

Friday March 2 1849
first part light baffling winds
latter part very weather
Ship Abigail in sight latter
part moderate Lat 19° 35' Long 170° 38'

Saturday March 3 1849
first part squally weather
wind from S to S.W. latter part
strong breezes and cloudy weather
Lat 20° 5' S Long 170° 57' E

Sunday March 4 1849
through the day moderate breezes
and fine weather Lat 20° 01' S Long 172° 00'

Monday March 5 1849
all these 24 hours squally weather
Ship heading to the Eastward
No obs to day

Thursday March 6 1849
first and middle parts squally
weather latter part fine weather
and moderate breezes S.E. Ship
heading to the west Lat 20° 49' S Long 171° 21'

Wednesday March 7 1849
through the day moderate
breezes and fine weather
Lat 20° 6' S Long 170° 18' E

Thursday March 8 1849
through the day fine weather
wind wind from S.E. E
Lat 19° 50' S Long 170° 00'
