

Mr. Baker all day with *Agassiz*
the 29 day of April 1849

Saturday April 28th 1849
first part employed fitting the
boats ship heading to the southwest
later part employed repairing the
Lambert Boat at 10 AM the
Ship Abigail had a man fall over
board and was drowned before the
boat could get to him
Lat 61° 30' S Long 159° 45' E by Chron 158° 56'

Sunday April 29 1849
first part moderate breezes and
fine weather later part cloudy
weather at 8 AM saw sperm whales
at 10 sawed all the mated with
Ship Abigail struck and killed
3 the day ends in generally weather
8° N obs

Monday April 30 1849
at 1 PM took the whale to
the ship and commenced cutting
at 5 PM finished and beached
up by the wind to the SSW
later part tacked to the SW
all hands employed in clearing away
the blubber and bailing at 6 AM saw
the land 8° N obs to sea

Tuesday May 1st 1849
through the day employed
bailing Ship Abigail in company
Lat 8° 17' S Long 158° 40' E

Wednesday May 2 1849
through the day strong
breezes from SE at 10 AM beached
sawed them to be sperm whales
Lat 8° 10' S Long 158° 38' E

Thursday May 3rd 1849
first part strong breezes from SE
Ship heading to the SE by the wind
later part strong breezes and fine
weather Lat 9° 25' S Long 158° 00' E

Friday May 4th 1849
through the day strong breezes from
SE Ship heading SE by compass Ship
Abigail in sight to the SE and
Lat 11° 24' S Long 157° 38' E

Saturday May 5th 1849
first part strong trade at 11
carried away the part nose of the
main top sail sent it down and
beant a ab bare top sail in its place
all hands employed in repairing it

Sunday May 6 1849
through the day strong breezes
Ship heading to the S and westward
by the wind Lat 15° 40' S Long 156° 38'

Monday May 7 1849
first part moderate breezes at 4
PM spoke Ship Abigail and took
her on board of her later part
strong breezes a Lat 17° 58' S

Tuesday May 18 48
through the day strong
breezes from SE Ship heading
by the wind Ship Abigail in
sight Lat 19° 14' S Long 155° 10' E
