strong breezes from the westward
the latter part moderate breezes
from S. Lat 31° 47' Long 167° 6' E

Sunday June 3 1849
Through the day moderate breezes
from S. Ship heading E by S by the
wind Lat 30° 45' Long 168° 30' E

Monday June 4 1849
Through day moderate breezes from
S. to S.W. Ship heading to the west
Lat 31° 09' S

Tuesday June 5 1849
Through the day moderate breezes
and cloudy weather Employed hauling
down rib in the fore hatch
Lat 32° 13' S

Wednesday June 6 1849
Through the day Employed hauling
down rib weather pleasant Lat 31° 13'

Thursday June 7 1849
First part Employed hauling down
rib latter part ~~same~~ Lat 30° 45' E
at 5 1/2 PM Mr James fell from
the fore top of mast head to the
deck striking in 3 or 4 places ^{he} fore
reaching the back his head has 2 cuts
on it he remains in some pain and
in his senses latter part light air
and fine weather but no whales Mr
James is some better Lat 30° 42' S
Long ~~167°~~ 165° 58' E

Friday June 8th 1849
First part moderate breezes and fine
weather the water Employed clearing
Ship latter part strong breezes
S Lat 31° 00' Long 166° 00' E

Saturday June 9 1849
Through the day moderate breezes
thick weather Spauke Ship Abigail
and Mrs Jagg came on board
165 1/2 AM Spent the afternoon Mr J
165 1/2 PM Jones is much better Lat 32° 00'

Sunday June 10 1849
Through the day strong breezes
and foggy weather but no whales
Lat 30° 46' Long 167° 30'

Monday June 11 1849
Through the day strong breezes
from S.W. Lat 30° 31' Long 167° 27' E

Tuesday June 12 1849
all these 24 hours strong breezes
from the westward with fine weather
and no whales Lat 30° 32' 168° 05'

Wednesday June 13 1849
Through the day strong breezes
from S.W. 8 PM Sings of whales
Lat 31° 15' Long 167° 36' E

Thursday June 14 1849
Through the day moderate
breezes and fine weather Lat 31° 00'

Friday June 15 1849
all 24 hours light breezes Lat 31° 06' 167° 36'
