first part strong gales from
S.W. with rain latter part
somewhat to S. weather clearing
at 5 AM set the 3rd Gals table
reel and started S.W. by compass

Sunday July 1 1849
Through the bay moderate breezes
Lat 31 12 Long 172 52 E

Monday July 2 1849
Through the bay calm and 800
whales Lat 31 28 Long 172 00

Tuesday July 3 1849
Through the bay strong breezes
Lat 31 30 Long 173 20

Wednesday July 4 1849
all these 24 hours moderate
breezes and fine weather
Lat 31 49 S Lat 174 40 E

Thursday July 5 1849
the bay begins with fine weather
Lat 32 20 Long 177 40 E

Friday July 6 1849
Through the bay calm
Lat 33 00 Long 178 14

when my wife or
look upon these lines they may think of
my time as happy state here without a care
of Gales being + I have been sick for 2 or 3
weeks and I was taken with a cold which
went upon my side and back which
I have been unable to get rid of

Through the bay calm and fine
weather Lat 33 14 S

Sunday July 8 1849
first part calm weather fine
latter part moderate breezes
from E Lat 33 14 S Long 174 15 E

Monday July 9 1849
Through the bay moderate breezes
from E Lat 32 55 S

Tuesday July 10 1849
Through the bay strong
breezes from E Lat 31 55 S

Wednesday July 11 1849
Through the bay strong breezes
and fine weather all hands employed
building up the 3rd tank and
cleaning the chain blocks
Lat 31 56 S

Thursday July 12 1849
Through the bay moderate
breezes and fine weather Lat 31 40

Friday July 13 1849
all these 24 hours strong breezes
and fine weather 800 whales
Lat 31 30 S Long 169 37 E

Saturday July 14 1849
the bay begins with moderate breezes
and fine weather and 800 whales
and my self very unwell and in
much pain Lat 30 50 Long 168 40 E
