Through the day moderate breezes and
fine weather Lat 31 06 S

Wednesday Aug 1st 1849
Through the day moderate weather
Lat 30 53 S Long 168 30 E

Thursday Aug 2 1849
Through the day employed
Scrapping Ship Lat 30 59 S

Friday Aug 3 1849
First part employed in painting
Ship latter part saw sperm
whales lowered all the boats the
Starboard boat struck and had to
pull from the whales by getting the line
paul to cast the whale by and so
latter part boats in chase of
the whales many in sight
but got nothing so ended the day

Saturday Aug 4 1849
first part moderate weather
the boats in chase of the whale
latter part no signs of whales
Lat 31 23 Long 165 47 E

Sunday Aug 5 1849
all these 24 hours moderate
winds from South Lat 30 40
Long 165 24 E

Monday Aug 6 1849
first part strong breezes from South
with a swell from the westward 880
Signs of whales and my self sick
both in body and mind latter part the
same Lat 30 20 S

Tuesday Aug 7 1849
first part moderate breezes and
fine weather latter part the
same Lat 30 19 S 165 45 E

Wednesday Aug 8 1849
Through the day strong breezes
from SW Ship heading ESE
Lat 31 33 S 170 10 E

Thursday Aug 9 1849
Through the day strong
breezes from South with rain
Lat 31 53 S Long 170 47 E

Friday Aug 10 1849
first part strong breezes from
South Ship heading East Lat 2.
pm saw sperm whales lowered all
the boats the waist boat struck and
lost the line the Starboard struck
and saved the whale at 6 pm South
the whale the Ship at 6 began to
cut and 6 saw more sperm
whales lowered all boats the
day ends with the boat in chase of
the whales
So obs to day
